

Methodology & Findings

We looked at expenses that directly affected the local economy. Compared to previous years, our technology has advanced to give better precision in the data provided.

For military payroll, we looked at pay grades and used the Department of Defense (DoD) Military Personnel Composite Standard Pay and Reimbursement Rates to calculate payroll.

Our findings show that expenditures at the Base Exchange have significantly decreased. Construction and Service Contracts have increased at a steady rate. Utilities jumped due to gas price increases. Lodging has closed at the installation, so it was removed from expenditures.
